Navigating the Public Portal K-6 – Rocky View Schools

If you have not already done so please take a moment to create your PowerSchool Portal Account. This online portal allows you to have instant access and up-to-date information on student academic performance and attendance. Consistent with RVS' communication of student learning, all teachers will now be using our PowerSchool system to record and share assessment information. You'll be able to see all of your students in one place, regardless of if they are at multiple schools. You can also access most information from your mobile device by logging into the **PowerSchool App** which syncs with the Parent and Student portals.

Staying informed and engaged using the PowerSchool Parent Portal allows you to celebrate milestones and successes together. It also provides the opportunity to identify any issues that might require early intervention such as chronic absences or a sudden drop in grades. This is a quick "how-to" document with screenshots to demonstrate how to navigate the Public Portal.

Overview of Achievements

École Manachaban has many successes to celebrate in our pursuit to deliver an excellent, well- rounded education for our students.

Goal One – Learners are successful.

All three of the Rocky View Schools (RVS) Accountability Pillar Outcomes for this goal are above the RVS average results. Students are successful in both Literacy and Numeracy. We continue to be above the provincial acceptable standards in our PAT results. Data from the English Language Arts Achievement Test show our students to be above the provincial average in both the acceptable and excellence standards. Looking at the data more closely, in the Reading sub-test of the PAT, 91.2 % of our students achieved the Acceptable Standard, with 47.1% achieving the Standard of Excellence. Students are also demonstrating above acceptable standards in mathematics compared to the province, exhibiting strong skills in addition, subtraction, multiplication and division. Students feel strongly that they take responsibility for their own learning and feel confident that they can succeed in school. Additionally, students, parents and staff report that learners are building skills and knowledge in the 21st Century competencies.

Goal Two – Learners are engaged.

Again, all three of the RVS Accountability Pillar Outcomes for this goal are above the RVS average results. There is a consistent approach to develop real-world, hands-on learning experiences which engage students. Our opportunities for alternative programs, such as French Immersion or the WILD outdoor inquiry program, coupled with extensive field experiences in all grades, allow this to happen. Staff continues to make learning experiences as connected to the real world and as innovative as possible.

École Manachaban students have access to quality technology to support their learning and feel that this technology helps them to do better school work. Technology can improve engagement in the learning process therefore closing achievement gaps and improve ways to present learning materials. Through the use of technology students can grasp complex concepts and improve on skills such as critical thinking, creativity, innovation, and problem solving.

Goal Three – Learners are supported.

In the third goal for the RVS four-year plan, our school community reports results above the RVS average in two of the three outcomes. Similarly, our APORI results show that we score Very High in the Safe and Caring Schools category. Clearly, our learners feel well, safe, valued and respected. Students report that they feel welcome at school and that teachers provide them with the help that they need. Decisions made in the school are student centered resulting in enriched achievement for our learners.

Breakfast Program at Manachaban

The breakfast program at Manachaban has been going wonderfully. We are averaging 65 to 85 students per day. They visit the breakfast program for many reasons. They got up late, they needed to shower, they ate and are hungry again, they cannot eat first thing in the morning or they just want to visit with their friends. Our program is funded by The Breakfast Club of Canada, President's Choice breakfast program and by donations from our generous community. Goal One – Learners are successful.

Staff at École Manachaban understand the importance of ensuring that our students' grow in Literacy and Numeracy. Parents have indicated that they feel their children are demonstrating appropriate reading, writing, and numeracy skills. Teachers are continuing to improve support and instructional design to constantly improve these skills. Staff has taken the time to become familiar with the jurisdiction's Literacy and Numeracy Framework. We are working together in subject and grade specific groups to discuss PAT results and to determine and share best teaching practices. Based on this work students will receive the supports they require to ensure student success.

Teachers have identified key areas and are developing strategies to focus on, based on their collaborative work. These strategies include using graphic organizers to support functional writing, collecting exemplars in each grade and to frontload vocabulary to improve reading comprehension. Staff has understood the importance of keeping student learning front and center.

Parents and Students have identified that there is room for citizenship development and school staff could help further with developing these skills. Students will be challenged to develop character traits that will improve their citizenship. This will be done with a focus on developing a school culture based on the WARRIOR character traits – worker, attitude, respectful, resilient, integrity, one hundred percent, reliable. Strong character is important for success in life. It helps in goal achievement, healthy relationships, and improved work ethic.

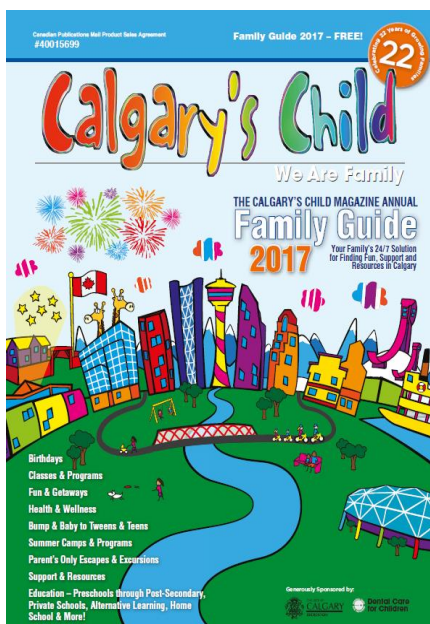
Goal Two – Learners are engaged.

École Manachaban supports the MakerSpace mindset to improve instructional design to make learning more engaging and interesting with a focus on developing skills in creativity and innovation. Innovative and effective practices will enrich the learning environment for all learners. Cultivating curiosity and allowing students to explore their personal interests and to wonder about the world around them is key to engagement. Students will develop problem-solving skills, high standard for quality with a deeper purpose and passion. Community members will be invited in to share their skills, guidance, coaching and knowledge.

The Learning Commons will be a place where students will have access to and encouragement to discover a world of content in both books and digital tools. This exploration will be supported by experts who will teach students how to apply this information and ideas to their learning resulting in a mastery of these transferable skills.
