Welcome and Intros

Agenda then adopted by consent.

Minutes from previous meeting presented and passed.

## Staff Report

- · Active Living Day was very successful kids had fun and there were lots of parent volunteers
- · Parent/Teacher interviews happened before the Family Day week break
  - parents who were unable to meet with teachers are still welcome to give the teachers a call and set up a brief meeting if they wish
- Feb 15 was a school-based PD (Professional Development) day
  - each teacher has a project for the year and this day allowed them to discuss and further their ideas
- convention was last week
  - some years are better than others depending on what sessions are offered and what a particular teacher is teaching
  - teachers were able to tour various city facilities to get a feel for possible field trips (eg Science Center, Glenbow, College of Art and Design)
- term 2 ends on March 15
  - · report cards will come out/be available the following week

# **Treasurer Report**

- current balance is \$12,235.92 (walkathon money is in)
- money earmarked to spend:
  - up to \$2000 for new jerseys jerseys are still being sourced
  - $\sim$  \$4500 for active living day (\$10 per student based on 448 students)
  - ~\$1000 for the grade 5 Frank Slide trip
- · other possible expenses:
  - last year \$1000 went to the school compassion fund (to help fund students for school trips that might not
    otherwise be able to afford it (at administration's discretion)) this request seems to come up every year,
    but has not yet been raised
  - · replacement hoops for outdoor basketball courts
  - high jump mat this was mentioned at the beginning of the year could come out of the casino money as well

## Admin Report

- · Parent Focus Group
  - met Feb 12 to discuss going paperless for mid-year report cards
  - · six parents showed up
  - · general consensus was that there is no real reason not to do this

- next step is to come up with implementation plan (eg dates)
- · last issue is about comments in powerschool
  - · these appear in several locations under term work, specific assignments, and overall
  - · can be inconvenient to look at them all
  - having a section for running comments might work, but there could be character limits (2400?)
- · how often should grades be updated? general agreement seems to be every 4-6 weeks
  - this could be onerous for some subjects (eg music) where one teachers sees just about every student in the school
  - term end is a natural spot
  - parent/teacher nights is another
- parents indicated that they don't need curricular comments (eg. "This term we studied x and worked on y...") - perhaps these could be put in at the beginning of the year and deleted for space as the year progresses
- facilities
  - Rockyview has approved \$100,000 for Manachaban out of its Infrastructure, Maintenance, and Renewal Budget (IMR Budget)
  - · school is currently space challenged in a number of areas ideas will focus on best use of available space
  - Manachaban teachers have been brainstorming about how to make changes and ideas have been collected
  - planner is coming to the school to look at the ideas to determine what is doable
  - · eg. looking at team teaching for the grade fives
    - this is where teachers would share the teaching of a subject and re-divide classes to better focus on strengths of teachers and students and gives students two teachers to approach for help
    - · this would involved students moving between classrooms
    - to facilitate this would like to see doors put in between classrooms and small breakout rooms created
      meeting with planner will determine how feasible this is
- · School is partnering with the Boys and Girls Club
  - · Build-It Club will meet once a week at lunch
  - · would be a place for boys to meet and build stuff
  - will start with 2-3 students by invitation only (several have been identified as benefitting from such a program)
- · Evening of Excellence
  - planned for June 25 to recognize top grade 7 & 8 students in many areas academic, athletic, music, leadership, etc
  - hoping this leads to a culture shift favoring excellence (another Rockyview school known for its excellence does this)
  - · still working on details:
    - · how many students?
    - · when do invites get sent?
    - · what criteria for invitation?

# Trustee Report

- Board has approved IMR Budget this includes borrowing \$200,000 against next years IMR Budget for all the work it wants to see done across the division
- no word yet on portables should know more by the time the provincial budget is released (Mar 7)
- Trustee Ward Boundaries
  - · next election is coming in October any request for ward boundary changes must be submitted by Mar 1
  - have been looking at all the population changes in Rockyview
  - looking at representation by population two wards are quite busy (Airdrie and Chestermere)
  - board decided that they had left it too late and any decisions would be too rushed would prefer to consult with communities
  - put a motion on the books that the next board re-examine this issue early in their mandate
- Accommodation plan for Glenbow and Mitford will be discussed by board on March 7 (have already had three
  meetings with the community) schools will be short 4 classrooms in the fall
- A new teacher agreement has been proposed to the ATA and the School Boards

- must wait until Feb 27 to hear if there is an agreement in principle (would still need local ratification)
- question was asked about transportation costs to parents (\$135 for a student seems like a bargain)
  - Rockyview receives a transportation grant of \$25 million to offset costs
  - Rockyview transports the most students of any board ~30,000 a day

#### Future Item:

- · Links for Learning Golf Tournament will have a presenter at next meeting
- · a discussion ensued about differing attitudes toward competition
  - Alfie Kohn was a speaker last week who believes competition can be harmful to students (can lead to imbalance of power which can lead to bullying) <a href="http://www.alfiekohn.org">http://www.alfiekohn.org</a> for more info.
