## Treasurer Report

## Staff Report

- Field trips
- Grade 7s to Heritage Park
- Cochrane High School had the leadership students
- Band Camp for grade 7\&8s was successful
- term 2 has ended - options have changed - hockey is done for the school year

- B Basketball has wrapped up
- Badminton is starting
- Arctic Lights presentation by John Dunn - three sessions
- Grade 5 vaccination this week
- Spring Fling dance is the Thursday afternoon before the Easter break
- Grades 5 and 6 will have a planning meeting for outdoor camps (Grade $5 s$ will not be going to the Frank Slide this year due to rising costs)
- Meeting for parents planning the Grade 8 farewell is coming up
- Quebec trip is in May
- Mme Katt has a student teacher


## Admin Report

- have observed that grades 5 and 6 at lunch in the gym are spending a lot of time on personal devices
- being asked to unplug themselves
- wondering of making this a policy starting in the fall
- council supports
- Grades 7 and 8 are not as much of an issue
- Proposed outdoor class for the fall
- this is a class of grade 8 english students who would be outside for their learning as much as possible with an extra cost for parents (est $\$ 500$ per student)
- senior executive at school board have received the idea well, except for the $\$ 100,000$ required for another teacher (new class would be limited to 20 students, at least for the first year) and another teacher would have to be hired to keep remaining Grade 8 classes to a reasonable level
- talked to kids, but not parents yet - approx 45 students expressed an interest
- still working on criteria
- meet with Murray B tomorrow at 11
- what about after grade 8 - some students would greatly benefit from this new program, but what will they head into in grade 9 ?
- Bow Valley has a really rich outdoor program
- Cochrane High has much more outdoor programming available starting in grade 10
- no definitive answer
- proposed Literacy, Numeracy block for the fall (reduces english options from 3 to 2 )
- progressing along - looking at essential outcomes
- numeracy is straight forward
- literacy is not as simple
- are being advised that it might be better to focus on the teachers
- (teachers are taught how to teach reading at the elementary school level, not at middle school level)
- maybe start with numeracy block and add in literacy
- Evidence Summary
- still some technical issues
- should be sent on later this week
- staffing
- extra support staff previously needed is no longer needed - student left
- Mr Levson is retiring after 46 years - send-off in June
- may have 2 FI postings for grades $5 \& 6$ (job must be posted if currently held by a temporary or probationary teacher)
- currently have three FI classes in grade 5
- not sure about next year
- currently looks as though there will only be $11 / 2$ grade 5 english classes arriving in the fall
- recognition of academic achievement
- continue with Evening of Excellence for grades 7\&8
- recognize grades 5\&6 in class


## Trustee Report

- meeting with MLAs to advocate for new school
- current top three on wish list
- another K-8 for Cochrane in Fireside
- school for Airdrie
- school for Chestermere
- RVS has had 6 new schools approved in the last three years
- when all are finally built, will still be at $100 \%$ utilization
- very fast growing school board
- another 8 modulars at Mitford (brings the total to 20)
- student fees staying the same
- transportation fees
- need to see the budget to determine whether fees will rise or stay the same
- board heard a proposal looking at an alternate calendar (shorter summer break, start sooner in fall, more breaks during the year)
- Ralph McCall school in Airdrie has used this calendar for years (staff love it) but must now conform to the RVS calendar due to new feeder schools
- motion was made to look into all of RV using the alternate calendar
- budget arrives in June


## New Business

- Next casino is scheduled for Sept 16 \& 17
- shift times have changed since the AGLC has allowed gaming tables to open earlier and close later
- early shift now starts at 10am instead of 11am
- late shift ends at 3am instead of 2am
- will need to start paperwork in May to indicate what the casino money will be spent on
- Mme Katt has been nominated for the Excellence in Teaching award
- motivated by a parent whose student was in grade 8 last year.
