Bylaw Review

• Wayne put forth a request for a standing committee to review the current bylaws (last amended in 2001)

- · agrees to head up
- · call will be put out to any parents who wish to assist
- present in December [this will probably have to be at the Nov 23 meeting or the January 25 meeting since school council does not meet in December]

Treasurer Report

- currently have \$8579.52 after \$350 School Council Grant
 - approx \$4000 for buses for active living day still to come out

Staff Report

- · pancake breakfast was very well received even had to rush out for more batter
- · meet the staff night was very well attended
- · school is participating in the Town of Cochrane e-waste challenge
 - the school that is able to collect the most weight in e-waste will win \$1000
 - · e-waste includes any device which plugs in eg computers, tvs, etc
- · volleyball has started
- picture day was last week
- tuck shop is now open

- · WILD class had their first camp
- · lunch for students is an upcoming event
- · Oct 8 is the Terry Fox run Terry's brother Fred will be coming as part of the 35 year anniversary
- · cross-country running team has started approx 20 students involved
- meditation club has been started
- Oct 23 is the Walkathon
- Oct 21 and 22 is parent-teacher night
- · there will be a cook-off for Halloween

Admin Report

- New school policy is to keep personal devices out of the classroom
 - teachers love it
 - · parents are supportive
 - · students still have breaks and lunch to check their cell phones
 - some classroom work will still involve computers, tablets
 - school has approx 200 laptops, 60 chromebooks, and a cart of iPads that can be used in classrooms
 - · upcoming meeting with staff will discuss further
 - Mitford now has a one-to-one policy (every student should have/have access to a computer) for grades 7 and 8
 RVS policy is to encourage the use of personal devices, but not require them
- Fundraising Society will be approached to provide:
 - new screen and projector for the gym
 - · new screen for the learning commons
- staffing
 - · have gone from 18 home rooms last year to 16 this year
 - · last year had three grade 6 FI classes has become two grade 7 FI classes this year
 - · last year had extra funding for two WILD classes only one this year
 - WILD class this year is at 32 with two on the waiting list
 - · classes sizes go up to 38 (province has class size guidelines, not strict limits)
 - · looking at use for empty classroom
 - Cochrane High has CHAT (Cochrane High Art Therapy) a room set aside for exploration of Art as therapy
 - · would like to implement something like that here
- · Walkathon is scheduled for Fri Oct 23 with a rainout alternative of Oct 26
 - · need volunteers for the day of the event parent response is good so far
 - also need parent volunteers to help organize beforehand
 - prizes
 - in previous years have had prizes of ipods, police rides, gift cards to Market Mall
 - do we still need all these prizes? Do they motivate kids to get more sponsor money?
 - keep the pizza party prize for top class in each grade
 - maybe just have a gift card to Market Mall for top individual in each grade
 - simplifies things for parents soliciting prizes
 - food
 - hot dogs and buns approx 1200
 - approach the grocery stores
- have already had parent meeting night for the Quebec trip (aimed at FI and FSL students) and the Bamfield trip (aimed at english students)
- · Quebec trip request for compassionate funding
 - two families have indicated they can't really afford the \$2300 price, but could go to \$1500
 - school council in the past has not specifically funded requests like this but have funded a lump sum deemed "the compassionate fund" for the principle to apply as seen fit
 - families have been made aware of fundraising opportunities eg Spolumbo's Sausage that must be parent driven
 - requests like this in the past have come up closer to the final payment date (usually Feb) what happens if more people are unable to pay for the trip later on? Calgary economy continues to see layoffs
 - don't need to make a decision tonight defer until Oct

- Grandparents club has requested \$200
 - · this is an annual request
 - motion to fund \$200 to the Grandparents Club made by Dawn-Marie, seconded by Krista pased
- Professional Learning:
 - Wayne Hammond is coming Oct 13 to spend a half day on values and hidden assumptions
 - Oct 9 will be self-directed learning

Trustee Report

- superintendent is focussing on literacy and numeracy
- RVS has grown by 1000 students this year now over 21,000 students in Rockyview
- Oct 1 is the board organizational meeting
- · Three new schools are currently being built
 - Ranchview is the k-8 school in Sunset Ridge in Cochrane
 - Airdrie has Cooper's Crossing and H. Lorimer
- this fall will see sod turning ceremony for new school in Fireside in Cochrane to be completed in 2017
- with new schools in Cochrane:
 - · Glenbow and Elizabeth Barrett will become dual track english/french immersion school k-5
 - Manachaban will become grade 6-8 school (with FI from Glenbow feeding into it)
- Rockyview schools will now have three area superintendents (for West, Airdrie, and Chestermere)
 Manny Ferreirinha for West (includes Cochrane)
- relocatable classroom requests must be in by Nov 1
- Oct 6 will be meeting with the Education Minister
